



Flower Shipping Instructions

Please follow these instructions carefully to ensure your fresh flowers arrive in the best shape possible. You are encouraged to send a lot of flowers in color and type variety, as that will result in the best end products. That said, even if you only have a flower or two in rough shape, we can still make something beautiful from your sentimental flowers. Send them over!

- Cut off the tops of your flowers, leaving 1 to 2 inches of stem and put them in sandwich size ziploc bags. Gallon or quart are too large. Sandwich size works best.
- Do not overfill the bags and do not seal them - leave them open to breathe and put a few in each bag. It may seem like a lot of baggies, but it really helps them arrive in the best shape. It's worth it!
- Separate different types of flowers into their own bags (roses in one bag; lilies in another; etc.). Flowers like orchids and lilies hold a lot of moisture and can cause molding and spread to others.
- If sending lilies, please cut off the stamens (the pointy part in the middle). The stamen has brown powder that can stain your flowers.
- When ready, put your open baggies in a box and pad them with packing peanuts, tissue or paper to help keep them in place. Please use a box and not a padded envelope. Your flowers will get crushed in a padded envelope.
- Do not include a paper towel with water or water tube - nothing with any moisture should be included, as that can produce mold.
- Please do not mix fresh and dry flowers; instead, place them in separate bags.
- Include your name and contact information inside the box to ensure we know who the flowers belong to.
- Order the items you want online, and once we've received your flowers we will contact you if we have any questions. If no questions, we will make your items and send you a final invoice for the shipping charges. Once payment is complete, we will ship your carefully packaged items.
